EDITORIAL – MAY 2025

Due to unforeseen circumstances the April General Meeting or the ACMC was cancelled and, therefore, for the first time in the sixty years of the Club's history, there are no minutes in this edition of the Magazine.

As previously advised, if you do not attend the three required meetings and/or events your Historic Vehicle will not be registered. Please note that genuine exceptions will be considered by the President if attendance is not reached. However, you will need to provide written valid reasons.

Many of our fellow Antique and Classic car clubs are struggling with dwindling numbers of members. If you want your Club to continue, then you need to ensure you attend Meetings and Events and do your share of the work. There is a mention of our latest outing on Page 6. We would love to see more ladies at our future monthly meetings, your contributions and suggestions will be greatly appreciated.

All membership fees should have been paid by now to comply with the rules set out by Transport for NSW. If your fees were not paid by 31st March 2025, you are no longer a financial member, and your Historic Vehicle Registration/s will be cancelled. More information about how to pay your membership is provided below.

On 12 April 2025 I attended the Council of Motor Clubs Registrar Information Seminar. It was again emphasised how important it is to be a current financial member. If not, your vehicle is both unregistered and uninsured.

Members are reminded that you need to insist that <u>ALL</u> your Clubs, not only your Primary Club, are listed on your Certificate of Operations. This is important when you wish to go out with your different Clubs. I have also noticed a number of registration papers do not include the VIN and/or engine number. You are urged to ensure these details are noted. It may be important if you are questioned by the police. You also need to carry your **Certificate of Approved Operations** with your **Log Book** as you will need to produce it if asked for your Log Book.

A reminder that you now need to complete a Vehicle Modification Indemnity Form for each vehicle each time you register it with the Club under the Historic Registration Scheme. If you do not supply me with the completed and signed form, I **CANNOT** authorise the renewal the registration of your vehicle. Details related to the use of Historic Vehicles are provided on **page 9**. To renew the registration, you will need the Modification Form, Rego Certificate, Pink Slip, 1259 form, log book and confirmation that the vehicle is insured. **Please do NOT send copies**. If you are going to mail papers to me, send them to Phillip Youngman at 7 Francis Avenue, Emu Plains. NSW 2750, please use a Yellow Express envelope so that it can be tracked. Registered Mail cannot be tracked. Don't forget to include a stamped self-addressed envelope as well.

If anyone is aware of any members becoming ill or changes in their circumstances, would you please contact **Margaret Turner**, the Welfare Officer. It is up to all of us to keep an eye out for each other.

ATTENTION ALL NEW MEMBERS – You will see on Page 10 how to access a Club Window Sticker or a Banner to put on your car windscreen when we attend events. Every Member is entitled to borrow 1 banner, free of charge. If you are interested, please contact John Turner.

N.B. – MEMBERS WITH VEHICLES ON HVS

To comply with TfNSW and NSW police policy, please ensure you have the following with you before setting off on any trips: -

- (1) THE ORIGINAL CERTIFICATE OF APPROVED OPERATIONS
- (2) PROOF OF FINANCIAL CLUB MEMBERSHIP
- (3) COPY OF CLUB MAGAZINE SHOWING THE CLUB OR INVITATION EVENT
- (4) CORRECTLY FILLED IN LOGBOOK, IF A PRIVATE TRIP OR A MAINTENANCE RUN OR IF YOUR CAR IS NOT ON A LOGBOOK, THEN A "PERMISSION TO MOVE" AUTHORITY FROM THE PLATES' REGISTRAR

If you have not opted in for the logbook trial and your vehicle has NOT been issued with a logbook, then by-laws 15.3.1 and 15.3.3 of the Antique and Classic Motor Club Inc. provide for servicing trips within an eight-kilometre radius of the notified point of garaging at any time. These trips DO NOT have to seek permission from the Plates' Registrar. However, road testing within a 15-kilometre radius after an extensive overhaul MUST be approved by the Plates' Registrar.
